

Presidential Perspective

SDJC Jaguar Tracks Presidential Perspective *May-June 2025*

So far, 2025 has seen many changes for Jaguar, JCNA, and SDJC. A great deal has been said and written about Jaguar's recent "copy nothing" approach, so I won't add to this. Of more immediate interest is the recent change in JCNA leadership, with Nedra Rummell and Mark Mayuga being selected to serve on the Board of Directors. As those of us in SDJC know, Nedra has been Membership Chair for many years and continues to be a very key contributor to all aspects of our club. She also recently served as JCNA Membership Chair and has now moved up to be JCNA Secretary while continuing as one of two Southwest Regional Directors. Mark is President of the Jaguar Owners Club of Los Angeles (JOCLA), the other Southwest Regional Director, and is now the JCNA President. Mark has been involved with JCNA and Jaguar for more than five decades as I recall and brings energy, passion, and commitment to his role. I am confident that Nedra, Mark and other members of the JCNA board will continue to address the challenges of membership retention and growth.

Another significant change is this will be the last Jaguar Tracks as a stand-alone publication. The earliest version in the club archives is from March 1961 (see pages 4-6; note the prices!), a three-page summary of club events typed with a manual typewriter and provided without photos or advertisements. Flash forward to this version. My math says that over ~775 editions have been provided over the 60+ years. That's a lot of news! So why is this the final version? Several factors came into play, primarily the Internet and the growth of social media, both of which allow near instantaneous recap of events and descriptions of upcoming events without the need to prepare dedicated monthly or bi-monthly newsletters. Another factor is the effort required to pull the *Tracks* together. This is a relatively big task that falls primarily to the Editor and a small group of member contributors. Past editors, including Gail Hoffman, Katherine Partain, Stick Holmes, Jim Hallameyer, Chuck Leuthern, Tim Calver, yours truly, and many others, took on the challenge to help keep members informed and engaged. While this is the last Jaguar Tracks, club information will be provided directly on the SDJC website, along with e-mail notifications of upcoming events and activities. This is an approach adopted by other JCNA clubs and has worked well.

A final change that affects the club, and me especially, is the loss of Jorgene, my wife, Jaguar copilot, and life counselor for 45 years. Those who experienced her warmth, humor, charm and beauty can understand the loss. Jorgene and I have driven only Jaguars for over 40 years and that was due to her appreciation of the style and grace that our Jaguars provided – just like her.

Here's hoping to see you at Jeremy's on the Hill on June 14 (see page 32).

March 1961

Following the January 1961 dinner meeting, Gladys Hawkins, Dr. McPheron, Bill Walter and the Editor were appointed as a committee to establish a competition point program as an added inducement for more widespread participation in sports car activities in the San Diego area. It was, and still is, the opinion of Dr. McPheron, the guiding light of the point system, that in order to encourage more Jaguar owners to become JCNA members, a firm program of interesting and attractive events must be in operation.

Since the number of established sports car clubs in the area is about fifteen, and since there is seldom a week passes which contains less than two or three events of some nature, it was proposed by Dr. McPheron, and seconded by Gladys Hawkins, that rather than compete with these organizations for dates, the Jaguar Club members would join in the events as participants or workers. In this manner, the membership would be able to enjoy themselves without the necessary drudgery of planning anything more than gasoline and rest stops or help at check points, etc.

The point program will be as follows:

One point should be made clear--the burden of work will fall to the contestants because it will be their duties to send a card to Editor Boyd Harford, 1819 Lyndon Road, San Diego 3, stating the event, placement, role as spectator, worker or competitor.

Particular emphasis this year will be upon team entries from the Jaguar Club. A team will consist of three autos. The more of these three-car teams, the merrier. It is hoped that more than just one team will form as it is anticipated this will stimulate a more competitive spirit within the club as well as give the club good publicity. Each driver and navigator will be provided with the Team patch as designed by Dr. McPheron. Incidentally, Commander Katcher is investigating having the item made in Japan, finished in silver thread to match our regular Club patch, which will fit in the designated area.

We are listing the events on the calendar so far. Additional entries will be added as they come in each month. Our faithful representative at the Council, Gladys Hawkins, will see to it you are informed through this column.






We have an App for That!



Do you want mobile phone access to your favorite Jaguar Club? There's two ways to get it – you can use a web browser and the SDJC webpage, or you can use the app!



Here are details using the app for the June Drive to Jeremy's on the Hill, and the August Afterglow.






Here are a few screenshots to show the look and feel of the app.

Here's an example for the Concours d'Elegance


Here's what happens when you click on the event





Notes from the Concours Judges Tent

2025 Season By Dave Allen, Chief Judge, San Diego Jaguar Club



The Concours Schedule is in full swing already. The LA Club has a "Double Header" at Huntington beach June 7th and 8th. The 1st event is the actual JOCLA Concours, the second is the Southwest Regional.

I held a Southwest regional Judges training school via Zoom on May 3rd, which met the "thirty days prior" rule for the LA Concours. The event went well with 18 attendees from JOCLA and SDJC. We had four apprentices! Huw Holwill, Mike Spencer and Sharon Wozniak from San Diego, and Bart Kessel from Los Angeles. I updated the training and test dates on the JCNA website for all Judges in attendance and coordinated with Charlie Hallums, JOCLA Chief Judge.

As I mentioned in the last Newsletter, the 2025 Rule Book updates are largely clarifications of existing rules with a couple of new rules. The most important rule changes are in the table below:

Certification Element	Old Rules	New Rules
Rule Book Test	Every Three Years	Every Year
Judge's School	Every Year	Every Three Years*

^{*} Attendance at a Judge's School more often than every three years is encouraged!!

One more rule change: If the battery is in a separate compartment, like an XJS or XKR for example, the battery is not judged, whether in Champion or Driven Division. If the battery is visible, when judging other components, then the battery is judged. Reminder – the boot is not to be opened for Driven Division entries.

I held an impromptu Hands-on Judges School prior to the Member Appreciation Luncheon May 10. What we lacked in numbers, Sharon Wozniak made up for with enthusiasm! Huw Holwill joined briefly but was overwhelmed by E-Type enthusiasts checking out his beautiful Silver '62 Roadster. Good times!

Back at home I finished the XJ8 repair, so our garage has room for the XK8 to get a quick cleanup prior to the Los Angeles Concours, where we are entered in both events.

US tariffs: Jaguar set to revive E-Type to calm worried nation (Satire piece)
Return of UK's best ever car will also solve climate crisis and rewild butterflies

Jaguar is considering reviving its classic, beloved E-Type sportscar in order to calm a worried, beleaguered nation beset by financial uncertainty and economic worry.

Widely considered the best car ever made in England, the E-Type will return to production lines in a bid to make everyone feel really quite nice and lovely following widespread uncertainty about the fate of the UK economy and other financial headwinds incomprehensible to most mortals.

Analysts believe the return of the E-Type will not only boost the falling FTSE 100 index, but also soothe international markets, reassure investors that the UK is a safe bet, solve the climate crisis and rewild endangered species of butterfly.

The 2025 JCNA AGM meeting, hosted by the Delaware Valley Jaguar Clubs, was held at the Sheraton Valley Forge Hotel in King of Prussia, PA. One hundred fifty-six people registered for one or more events during the four-day AGM. Representing the SW Region as a Regional Director, I was honored to attend Thursday's President's Dinner at Maggiano's Little Italy.

While the JCNA Board of Directors were meeting on Friday, more than eighty Delegates and guests from across North America were treated to the beauty and history of the area as participants in the Covered Bridge Driving Tour and Lunch.

The Simeone Museum was the site of Friday evening's welcome event where 124 people admired (drooled over) Dr. Simeone's collection of world-famous racing cars and we could view a Jaguar C-Type and D-Type in the same location!





The official JCNA Annual General Meeting was called to order on Saturday from 8:00 AM and adjourned at 3:00 PM. Post meeting, attendees had the option to attend various Tech Sessions, including:

- Lessons Learned from 44+ years Maintaining Jaguars
- Supporting Jaguar's Heritage and Provenance
- Concours Detailing What to Expect and Not to Expect
- When and Where to Use Dry Ice Cleaning

Saturday night concluded with the Annual Awards Banquet. The keynote speaker was Brandon Baldassari, the Jaguar executive charged with the successful introduction of their new, all-electric vehicles. He provided an overview of the "clean break", change to the new lineup, the accompanying rebranding strategy, and timeline for commercial introduction of the new car. He told us that the pink and blue coupes are concepts only and that the first model to hit the streets will be a four-door GT car. Prototypes are currently undergoing extensive road testing.

During the banquet, I was honored to be awarded the Coventry Foundation Founders Award [Editor: and well deserved!].





SDJC Board of Directors Meeting Minutes

James Waite May 14, 2025

Call to Order / Attendance:

The Meeting was called to order at 6:30 pm via Zoom Video Conference by the Club President.

The officers present were Dan Jensen, President; Diah Avery, 1st Vice President, Activities; Nedra Rummell, 2nd Vice President, Membership; Dave Allen, Treasurer and Chief Judge; James Waite, Secretary; Tim Calver, Newsletter Editor; Matt Allen, Webmaster; Al Steele, Director; Terry Tilton, Director and Auto Museum Representative; and Marie Allen, Historian.

Board Reports:

- **Secretary's Report**: James reported that the Minutes of the April 9, 2025, meeting were approved electronically and forwarded to the Newsletter Editor.
- Treasurer's Report: Dave A. reported that for April, the activities include income of \$2,453.50, comprising \$240.00 SDJC membership dues, \$41.50 for advertising, \$120.00 for Concours d'Elegance registration, and \$2,052.00 for the Member Appreciation Luncheon. The expenses were \$1,577.94, comprising bank fees (\$7.44), JCNA dues (\$220.00), deposit for the Members Appreciation Luncheon (\$1,000.00), Coventry Foundation membership (\$250.00), storage locker fees (\$85.00), email domain (\$5.50), and the web design software (\$10.00). Overall, we had net income of \$875.56 for the month, primarily due to the time phasing of receipts for the Member Appreciation Luncheon. The Club's finances remain healthy, as shown in the Treasurer's Report provided to the Board.
- Activities Report: 1st Vice President, Activities: Diah reported that:
- As to the May 10 Member Appreciation Lunch The event was a success with about 65 attendees.
- As to the June 14 Drive and Luncheon at Jeremy's on the Hill, Julian, CA The event details are being
 finalized, and a cost breakdown was provided to the Board. The venue requires a \$500 deposit. There is no
 food cost to the Club as each member pays individually. The event details and deposit were discussed and
 approved. The event flyer has been distributed via email.
- As to the August 9 Concours Afterglow Luncheon at the Rancho Santa Fe Golf Club, Rancho Santa Fe, CA —
 The event details are being finalized, and a cost breakdown was provided to the Board. The cost per meal
 is currently \$76.00. Diah asked for a meal supplement of \$11. The event details were discussed and
 approved. A Motion to keep the meal price at \$65 with a meal supplement of \$11 was submitted by Dave
 A, seconded by Nedra, and approved unanimously.
- As to the November 8 Election Luncheon at the El Camino Country Club, Oceanside, CA The event details
 are being finalized, and a cost breakdown was provided to the Board. A deposit of \$667.00 is required, and
 the cost per meal is about \$43 per person. There is no need for a meal supplement. The event details were
 discussed and approved.
- As to other events in 2025 and 2026: For September, she wants to organize a picnic. For January 2026, she
 wants to have a Holiday/New Year event with a Hawaiian Luau or James Bond 007 theme. For February,
 she wants to try an out-of-town event, perhaps Laguna Beach or Palm Springs.

- Membership Report 2nd Vice President, Membership: Nedra reported that:
- Since our last meeting, we have two new members: Claude Petty, Carolyn Hudson, and Cecil Hudson. A
 Motion to accept the new members was submitted by Terry, seconded by Dave A., and approved
 unanimously.
- The 2025 SDJC membership renewal process is continuing. As a result of the mail campaign, we had eight renewals. We are down from 143 regular memberships to 129, about a 10% decrease.
- The new member listing, the roster, the SDJC Membership Directory, and the SDJC Ownership Directory will be updated and forwarded to the Webmaster.
- Jaguar Tracks Newsletter Report: Tim C. reported that he is working on the May-June edition, which will be the final Jaguar Tracks monthly edition. In preparation, he requested items from various members.
- **Webmaster Report:** Matt reported that he continued to update the website, event photographs, member roster, classifieds, and advertiser's page; added upcoming event flyers; added and emailed the newsletter; sent eblasts of upcoming events; further investigated eblasts from sdjagclub.com instead of Wild Apricot; hosted the Southwest Region Judges Training session; and hosted the Zoom meeting.

Functional Chair Reports:

- Advertising Sales in Jaguar Tracks Dan Nothing to report.
- Auto Museum Terry reported that the sweepstakes for a car and other items are still proceeding. Also, tables for their September gala are still available, so contact Terry if you are interested.
- San Diego British Car Club Council (SDBCCC) Dave P. No report.
- Concours Chair Dave A reported that for the July 12 Concours d'Elegance, he has uploaded all required documents for the Port of San Diego and paid all outstanding invoices for parking and permits. He has requested an insurance certificate from JCNA, which he will upload to the Port Authority upon receipt. Additionally, he plans to book restrooms and inventory the trophies. Members should bring lunches and beverages as we are not scheduling a food vendor.
- **Property Manager** Dave A. Nothing to report.
- Chief Judge Dave A. reported that on May 3, he presented the Southwest Regional Judge's Training School online via Zoom with 18 attendees from JOCLA and SDJC. We had four apprentices who were Huw Holwill, Mike Spencer, and Sharon Wozniak from SDJC, and Bart Kessel from JOCLA. He updated the training and test dates on the JCNA website for all the judges in attendance and coordinated with Charlie Hallums, JOCLA Chief Judge. He also held a brief Hands-on Judges School before the Member Appreciation Luncheon, with Sharon Wozniak attending. Before our Concours, he will contact Mike Spencer and Huw Holwill for the Hands-on Judges School.
- **Dealer Representative** Jim H. Nothing to report.
- Raffles / Roster / Awards Nedra Nothing to report.

- **Social media** Diah reported that she and Nedra posted about the Member's Appreciation Luncheon on Instagram and Facebook. They will continue to update our accounts.
- **Historian** Marie Nothing to report.
- JCNA Updates and Concours News Nedra reported that:
- She attended the 2025 AGM. She will provide a summary to Tim for publication in the next *Jaguar Tracks*. The 2026 AGM is currently planned to be held in Mexico City. Nedra is working on possibly having SDJC host the 2027 AGM. She will report back.

Old Business:

- As to the Update of our Facebook page Diah and Nedra reported that we still do not have access to our
 original Facebook page, but they are working on it. We want to set up a new Facebook page for our Club
 and are seeking help.
- As to the expanded use of the SDJC website instead of continued bi-monthly Jaguar Tracks Dan. The Board discussed the phasing out of the monthly Jaguar Tracks and transitioning to a bi-monthly web-based magazine on our Club's website. 
