

We will again be in the usual **BROAD STREET BESIDE ALL THE SPECIAL SHOPS** that we have grown accustomed to in years past. This is a very quiet but elegant venue for our annual Sewickley Show, also known as "The Annual Display of Exceptional Automobiles". As in past years, the Jaguar Club of Pittsburgh will again share this event with 2 other fellow local Car Clubs invited as guests: Rolls Royce Owners Club, and the Ferrari Club (i.e., local Pgh chapter of the Ferrari Club of America). We will again have an exciting grouping, that will represent a breathtaking array of interesting cars, both modern and classics: Jaguars, Rolls Royces, Bentleys, Ferraris, and other marques ! Cars are parked with generous space in between, sufficient for everyone to get a close look of each, while "shoot-the-breeze" talking about all the things that car junkies among us love to share! Plus there are plenty of appreciative passersby and People's Choice trophies to be awarded.

Jon Leimkuehler Home Museum Tour and Visit June 8, 2025 – Springfield Rolls-Royce Collection

Several JCOP members joined the CCCA, Rolls-Royce and Cadillac Clubs of Pittsburgh at the home of collector Jon Leimkuehler in Upper St. Clair for a delicious dinner and visit to Jon's fabulous 12-car (or so) museum and workshop. John and Lorianne Putzier, Chuck Pipich, Eric Wagner and June Yonas, Cathy and Shadrach Jones, Cecile and Carl Canales, Richard and Roberta Aronson were the lucky representatives of JCOP among the Cadillac, Rolls and CCCA 60 total enthusiasts. Besides a 1953 XK-120 OTS, (about which Jon and I conferred years ago when Jon decided to do a complete resto), were his Rolls-Royce focused collection of various very rare examples of Springfield American made and designed Rolls-Royce cars of exclusive provenance. Only around 3,000 cars were built between 1921 - 1931 in the US. These cars are considered by most Rolls historians to be the most beautiful RRs made of the 1929 Springfield Rolls-Royce Phantom I Brewster Ascot classic era.

Jon's museum contains several of these magnificent cars. There are also a few family, sentimental cars in the collection including a 1955 Buick Special Convertible and a 1961 TR 3. Note that two of the Rolls-Royces are two late Silver Ghost Springfield models and rest are a bit later Phantom I cars. For good measure a gorgeous 1934 12-cylinder Packard in eye-popping two-toned metallic silver blues (we would say "opalescent"), with burnt orange striping and wheels is nestled among the Springfields. JCOP Provided High Octane Enjoyment with the Disabled Veterans at the Southwestern Veterans Center on June 28, 2025

A bevy of cars once again turned out in force for the 2025 Veterans Show organized by the Jaguar Club of Pittsburgh (JCOP). There were more Corvettes present than any other marque but there were some really nice British cars (including a 1947 Bentley, a 1968 Jaguar E-Type, a 1973 Triumph Stag in concours condition, a passel of other Jaguars and a modern Bentley) and a 2011 Lamborghini Gallardo. Steel Town Corvette Club (STCC) again had more cars and people in attendance than JCOP but everyone was appreciative of the efforts of Show Director Tom Nuhfer and the assistance of Scott O'Mara (who not only came with multiple ice chests full of soft drinks but he donated the same in honor of the disabled Veterans present). Every car present was just gorgeous.

While the weather forecast was, shall we say, "up in the air" for weeks and days leading up to the Veterans Show, Saturday, June 28 dawned sunny and nice. While clouds came in a bit, they cleared during the show and not a drop of water fell on the show. If anything, it was sunny although near the end we heard thunder since there were localized storms in the area but none touched us.

The Veterans turned out *en mass* to see the cars and talk with all of us. Coming out of the Southwestern Veterans Center with aides from the Red Cross or their families, the vets utilized canes, walkers, wheelchairs, and even a mobile bed. Amputees, double

amputees, and other impairments were observed. We got to interact with more vets than in previous years and the Brian Beach (the person at the Southwestern Veterans Center who worked with the Jaguar Club to coordinate the veterans' participation in the event) not only thanked both clubs for the great turnout of cars but more importantly how interactive and friendly the car owners were in talking with the disabled veterans. Various family members and Red Cross volunteers who wheeled vets around all reported that so many of the vets had a glint in their eyes they had not seen for some time and they attributed it to the substantial socialization enjoyed by the vets with the car owners.

By all accounts, more vets came out of the center to see the cars and talk with their owners than in any previous year. It was a two-way treat since STCC was present for that very purpose, namely to be a resource to interact and talk with the disabled veterans; the cars were just the incentive Continued on next page

to get conversations started about cars the vets owned and drove in the past, what cars they liked the best that were at the show and those they like that were not present, and this all segued into discussions about their service for our country. There was the obvious pride by the vets regarding the specific service branch they were in (Army, Navy, Marines, Air Force, Coast Guard) but competition between the branches took second fiddle today to the camaraderie enjoyed by everyone with everyone else. Both STCC and JCOP members were found enjoying the "other marques" and the owners of non-Corvettes enjoyed seeing the Corvettes and all owners talking with the other owners.

JCOP arranged this year to provide, free of charge, a nice selection of donuts from Oakmont Bakery, coffee from Starbucks, and multiple coolers filled with all



kinds of ice-cold soft drinks and water. It was a warm day and the drinks were welcome. Tom & Lynn Nuhfer arranged for the donuts, coffee, and bottled water to supplement the soft drinks supplied by Scott O'Mara.

While the Show was scheduled to run from 10:00 AM (which was when the Corvettes came up the hill from Washington Blvd and the rumble of the engines could be heard a long distance away) until 2:00 PM, it was decided to wrap up a bit early for a number of good reasons. One was the threat of rain with some thunder occasionally heard in the distance; looking on mobile phone weather apps showed showers that were localized here and there. Another reason was the Southwestern Veterans Center advising us that after a huge turnout of vets into the show lot in the morning, the vets went to lunch and after lunch they were scheduled for bingo and "nothing interferes with their bingo". Since no more



vets were going to be visiting with



us, we all agreed to wrap up the show most successfully and enjoyably. Members of STCC and JCOP interacted extensively and made new friends with each other, sharing many adventures from their work, family, and social and car histories that resonated with each other.

The North of Da 'Burg Road Tour

On Sunday, June 1, 2025 the Jaguar Club of Pittsburgh and the West Penn Miata Club joined together for a road tour (a/k/a "a cruise") on back roads in the North Hills area of Pittsburgh. Using vintage Pittsburgh vernacular, it was referenced to be called the "North of Da 'Burg Tour".

The group met at 1:00 PM at the Sheetz on Rt. 8 and East Hardies Road, immediately north of the PA Turnpike interchange for Hampton Township/Rt. 8. A Driver's Meeting was held with departure close to 1:30 PM. Stu Benson was the leader and provided detailed written directions to all cars. Additionally, most cars had a walkie-talkie radio tuned to Channel 12 for purposes of hearing communications from cars ahead of them as well as the "sweeper" car at the end of the pack. But with fourteen cars (and 25 people) from JCOP and 9 Miatas with 14 people, the group was large and things got "spread out" on the road with other vehicles that intervened in between our large group, folks missing turns (by not reading directions or not listening to the radio and, yes, a lead navigator calling out that the group should turn left when the directions said to turn right.

It was all great fun and adventure but lessons were learned as part of the group got so disconnected and found themselves out of mobile telephone coverage and unable to contact any of the lead cars such that this "lost group" decided to just go to the restaurant early and start enjoying libations and such until the main contingent arrived.

Lessons learned included: (1) with so many cars, it would be best to go out in smaller groups of cars with a leader for each group but giving each group ahead of them time to get out of radio range; (2) no one should attempt to go on such a tour without a navigator in the seat next to them to read directions and listen to the radio unless they literally stick to the bumper of the car ahead of them like Velcro; (3) Navigators in each car need to pay attention to the directions and not just be looking at scenery but most specifically, they need to keep a finger or paperclip on the last direction that was just followed so they could immediately go to the next direction when they need to view the directions and not road scenery. This is especially necessary for those who are tasked with using the radio to convey information and directions to the cars in their group behind them. Everyone makes mistakes but with the above modifications, smaller groups can get back on the route quickly and more easily. We found that most were not ready for any true "rally" drive that is timed and staged.

Our route was broken into two stages with the first being 33.9 miles of hills and dales and then a rest stop.

The ice cream was a sweet ending to a very sweet and enjoyable day as everyone then headed back home on different routes. JCOP members said they cannot wait for the next road trip like this and the West Penn Miata Club members – who take road trips almost every other week – were laudable in their praise of the JCOP trip's organization and choice of route and venues to eat and socialize. Many new friendships were commenced between members of the two clubs. Both JCOP and WPMC have members who are passionate about their vehicles and the enjoyment of driving them, as well as using the vehicles to provide a stage for socializing. Having such an event involving both clubs provided the ability for everyone to see the others' vehicles up close and be able to have fun both driving and eating together. That entire experience was, indeed, a real "Zoom-Zoom, Groowwllll".

Jaguar Mk2 restoration – Part 15

It has been a while since I have had any meaningful progress to report. My sisters and I have been very busy over the last few months tending to dad's estate and preparing the house for sale. Every weekend and a few weekday evenings were spent clearing, cleaning and repairing, leaving very little time for the MK2. The house is now under contract and the work is done. Time to play with cars again!

The elephant in the room has been the headliner. A task that I was not necessarily looking forward to as I don't have a lot of upholstery experience, but a task that must be completed before much more can be done to the interior of the car.

Recall that I had misplaced the clips that hold the headliner "listing sticks" in place. After tearing the basement and garage apart looking for them, I gave in and called Jagnut in Luray, VA, a great source for used classic Jaguar sedan parts. I complained to proprietor Jack about the cost of the parts and he informed me that he was giving me the clips for free (YEA!!). It was the cost for him to remove them that I should be complaining about. Fair enough.....




With the clips cleaned, painted and installed in the listing stick, I was ready to start the installation. I purchased a small, pneumatic upholstery stapler gun for the job and that turned out to be an excellent investment. The process requires a lot of patience, stapling, un-stapling, re-stapling, trimming and gluing. There were a few places where I started over and maybe even a few places that I am still not 100% pleased with, but I think we are calling it good. (PHOTO AT LEFT) The imperfections are not likely to be noticed and with a little steam and time, they may just work

themselves out. With the headliner installed, the next step is to install the "furflex" around all the door openings. This is the fuzzy ma-

terial that provides a finished look to the interior of the door openings and maybe even provides some wind and noise insulation should the rubber door seals not completely seal. It is essentially a rubber tube wrapped in the fuzzy material that is color matched to the car interior. The furflex is then stapled and/or glued into place with the flange being hidden by the wood interior trim or the vinyl interior panels. It is a slow and messy process but once in place it really starts to make the interior look like a very special place. (PHOTO AT RIGHT)

After the furflex, some of the interior wood and vinyl and leather covered panels can be installed. I started with the left side B/C post, and things are popping right into place.

All the wood in my car was professionally refinished and came with the car when I bought it. (PHOTO AT RIGHT) It is beautiful with the deep walnut grain and a very high gloss finish. In all, there are 23 individual pieces that are clipped, screwed or bolted into place. The rear wood cannot be completed until the rear windscreen is installed so I think that will be the next job.

There are some significant mechanical issues that are yet to be addressed. The charging system is still not working. I had a local auto electric company rebuild the generator with new bearings years ago and it was supposedly tested. Once the car was running, I found that the generator was not generating, which is really its only job. I took it back the generator shop, along with a spare generator I have, and they swapped some of the windings that had shorted. I'm not sure how this was missed the first time but it is working now with a steady 14.2V on the output. However, the output is not finding it's way to the battery. The wiring is correct and the



regulator is new so this will take further investigation. As an aside, I am now really, really good at removing and replacing Jaguar generators, having done it so many times. I don't want to brag but I'm probably top 5 percent of all the people in the world.

I also need to dig into the power steering to see if I have stopped the leaks and if it even works. These tasks require that the car be running which means I need to move it to the garage door opening if I don't want carbon monoxide poisoning. That is a lot of effort and will be under-taken when I have a solid chunk of time.

I did find my original headliner clips yesterday. Naturally, they were in the same bag as the sun visor mounts. I almost wish that I hadn't found them since I have moved on to a life with my new clips. If anyone needs MK2 headliner clips, I can make you a really good deal since the removal labor was zero.

The event has typically had on-field patron parking with spaces assigned an ad hoc basis with no particular arrangements for unique cars or groups of cars. The one exception is space on the south side corner of the polo field for the PVGP display.

There was a call between the PVGP and Family House in late June to discuss conceptually having spaces set aside for clubs/groups of unique & classic cars to be placed in the area adjacent to the PVGP display such that the interesting and unique cars will all be in one area and the "regular" patron parking moved to other locations.

By way of example, last year there were PVGP cars, some regular patron parking SUVs/daily drivers, and finally classic Cadillacs/Bentleys/Mercedes/Ferraris/etc. in a row. The new arrangement would assign the "regular" patron parking cars to elsewhere on the field.

I'll handle the general coordination with the Family House event planning team so that registrations can be assigned the appropriate parking spaces. A side note is I typically purchase an extra space or two so the cars can get a little more separation between cars so spectators can get by without "butt brushing."

I'm reaching out to a few other clubs & organizations to gauge their interest. Ideally we could place 30 - 40 cars (in addition to the 25 or so PVGP cars) in the South corner of the field.

Lastly, a starting point could be a "Save the Date" approach with details coming as the PVGP winds down and Family House gears up. Anyone interested can look for more details from me in the August Jaguar Jargon or feel free to contact me directly (cad60s@aol.com or M:412-559-7701) and I will take it from there with them. I realize that JCOP (and all Western PA British Car Clubs and other individual owners) will be back at Hartwood Acres some weeks later on September 28, 2025 for British Car Day that is organized by JCOP but that will be on the other side of the park by The Mansion with that entrance being off of Saxonburg Blvd. Both events are completely devoted to charitable fundraising but both are a most enjoyable day with different, enjoyable vibes.
